WHAT IS HAPPENING

The Disclosure Foundation will conduct a review of NASA archival material for UAP-related information, using expert analysis, citizen science, and modern data tools to identify anomalies that warrant further study.

WHY NASA

NASA holds large public archives of imagery, data, and related material. Some records may be public but not yet analyzed through the lens of UAP research. The initiative is designed to bring scientific discipline to that review.

Use artificial intelligence and machine learning where they can support careful analysis at scale.

Share findings with the public and interested government entities when warranted.
